



All Nations University (ANU) Admissions Policy

1. General Introduction

All Nations University (ANU) is committed to a holistic admissions process that identifies individuals with the potential for academic excellence, leadership, and ethical integrity. Our policy ensures that every applicant is treated fairly, transparently, and with dignity.

The admission requirements described in this policy are minimum entry requirements for consideration for admission into Graduate, Undergraduate and Diploma programmes. This guideline is guided by the directives of the National Council for Tertiary Education (NCTE), Ghana and Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC). All applications to the University must be accompanied by certified copies of the original certificates/transcripts from previous institutions or examination bodies. Awarding institutions must be accredited and recognized by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC). To meet the needs of applicants with diverse backgrounds, ANU has developed a number of admission categories. All Nations University reserves the right to arbitrarily accept or deny admission of applicants without explanation. A review of an admission decision may be requested, provided that substantially new and significant information is supplied to the Admissions Board.

1. Scope

This policy applies to all prospective students applying for Undergraduate, Graduate, Diploma, and Certificate programs across all campuses (Main Campus and City Campus).

2. Admissions Authority and Governance

The Admissions Board of All Nations University is the supreme body responsible for the oversight of the admissions process.

2.1 Role of the Board: Vetting applications, setting entry standards in alignment with the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC), and approving final enrollment lists.

2.2 Academic Discretion: While specific grades are required, the Board maintains the right to evaluate applicants holistically, considering professional experience and personal interviews where applicable.

3. Undergraduate Entry Requirements

ANU offers diverse programs in Business, Engineering, Humanities and Allied Health including Nursing and Emergency Medicine Technology. Admission is competitive and based on the following criteria:

3.1 WASSCE and SSSCE Applicants

Applicants must possess credit passes in six (6) subjects, comprising three (3) Core subjects and three (3) Elective subjects.

WASSCE: Credit passes (A1–C6) in Core English, Core Mathematics, and Integrated Science (for Science programs) or Social Studies (for non-Science programs).

SSSCE: Credit passes (A–D) in the same subject categories.

3.2 GCE Advanced Level Applicants

Passes in three (3) subjects (at least one grade D or better).

Credit passes (Grade 6) in five (5) GCE Ordinary Level subjects, including English, Mathematics, and a Science subject.

3.3 Mature Students Entry

ANU provides opportunities for adult learners who may not meet traditional academic requirements:

- **Age:** Minimum of 25 years at the time of application.
- **Requirement:** Must pass the Mature Students' Entrance Examinations in English Language, Mathematics, and an Aptitude Test.
- **Documentation:** Proof of age (Birth Certificate/Ghana Card) and relevant work experience.

3.4 Diploma and Professional Certificate Holders

Applicants with a recognized Diploma from a tertiary institution may be admitted to Level 200 or 300 depending on the relevance of their background.

Professional qualifications (e.g., ICA, ACCA, CIM) are evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

4. Graduate School Admissions

The Graduate School seeks candidates who demonstrate high-level analytical skills and leadership potential.

4.1 General Requirements

First Degree: A good first degree (at least Second Class Lower Division) from a recognized university.

Third Class Candidates: Applicants with a Third Class may be considered if they have significant work experience (usually 3+ years) and pass a selection interview.

4.2 Specific Programme Requirements

Programme	Requirement
MBA/ MSc	Bachelor's degree in a relevant field; interview performance
MPhil	Research-oriented; candidates usually need a CGPA of 3.0 or higher
PhD (Theology)	Master's degree in Theology or related field with a GPA of 2.00/4.00 or above

5. Diploma Entry Requirements

Applicants must have WASSCE/SSSCE/GBCE passes of at least grade D7 or D respectively in three (3) core subjects and three (3) elective subjects or credit passes in five (5) subjects including English Language, Mathematics and any Science subject at the GCE 'O' Level.

6. International Student Admissions

ANU is home to a vibrant international community. We welcome students from across the globe.

- ***Credential Evaluation:*** Certificates from non-English speaking countries must be translated and evaluated by the Ghana Tertiary Education Commission (GTEC).
- ***English Proficiency:*** Students from non-English speaking countries must provide proof of proficiency (e.g., TOEFL, IELTS) or undergo the ANU English as a Second Language (ESL) program.
- ***Non-Citizenship Card:*** All international students are required to obtain a Non-Citizen Ghana Card for residency purposes.

7. Transfer Students

Students from other accredited universities may apply for transfer to ANU.

- ***Transcripts:*** Official transcripts must be sent directly from the previous institution to the ANU Registrar.

- ***Credit Transfer:*** Only courses with a grade of "C" or better are eligible for transfer, provided they align with the ANU curriculum.

8. Ethical Standards and Non-Discrimination

All Nations University does not discriminate on the basis of race, color, nationality, gender, or physical disability. We are a co-educational institution that promotes an inclusive environment while maintaining our core Christian values.
